The Johnson School Scholarship Rules and Regulations

1. Students must have attended Johnson School for at least one year.
2. Applicants must satisfactorily complete a course of study from a Davenport Community high school by June 30, 2012.
3. Grants will be awarded on an objective and non-discriminatory basis without regard to age, sex or religion. Selections are based on academic achievement, extra-curricular involvement, financial need, and such additional criteria as shall be deemed appropriate by the selection committee.
4. Grants must be made for a course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the U.S.A and must be applied for within one year of receiving.
5. The Johnson School Scholarship provides a grant of \$500 each.
6. Completed applications must be postmarked by April 13, 2012 and mailed directly to:
