THE KATHRYN BELL TATE SCHOLARSHIP

Rules and Instructions

1. At least one parent of the applicant must be a current full-time employee of the Davenport Community School District.
2. Applicants must satisfactorily complete a course of study from a Davenport Community high school by June 30, 2012.
3. Grants will be awarded on an objective and non-discriminatory basis without regard to age, sex, race or religion. Selections are based on academic achievement, extracurricular involvement, financial need and such additional criteria as shall be deemed appropriate by the Selection Committee.
4. Grants must be made for a course of study leading to a Bachelor's Degree at an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the U.S.A.
5. The Tate award is a continuing scholarship to be applied towards tuition, books and fees. It provides a grant of \$3,000 per year for four years (total \$12,000) as long as the student maintains his/her eligibility with no less than a 3.00 average. By August 1, 2012, following his/her freshman, sophomore and junior years the student must submit a written request for renewal of the scholarship, accompanied by a transcript of his/her grades for the year ended and verification of his/her enrollment for the next school year. 6. Completed applications are due by March 23, 2012, and must be mailed directly to:

7. From the applicants, a Selection Committee will nominate five finalists. Finalists will be notified by April 6 to appear for interviews on Wednesday, April 11, 2012, from 10 a.m. to noon.
8. Release of awarded scholarship funds must be preceded by proof of enrollment at the institution proposed in the application. Copy of registration receipt or class schedule must be mailed to the Davenport Schools Foundation office before August 1, 2012.
9. Required:
 - a. Completed Student Application form
 - b. Letter of Reference
 - c. 300-word essay
 - d. Official copy of the applicant's high school transcript through the first semester of his/her senior year. Also include a copy of ACT results (and SAT, if available).
