### **THE KATHRYN BELL TATE SCHOLARSHIP AWARD**

The Kathryn Bell Tate Scholarship Fund was established by the Tate family in honor of their mother, Kathryn Bell Tate. Mrs. Tate was a long-time teacher at McKinley Elementary School in Davenport.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

At least one parent must currently be a full-time employee of the Davenport Community School District. Applicants must graduate from a Davenport Community high school by June 30, 2012. Recipients must be enrolled for the 2012-2013 term in an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the United States.

#### **SELECTION CRITERIA**

Selection of recipients is based on academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, moral character, and other conditions considered appropriate by the Selection Committee. All selections will be made on an objective and non-discriminatory basis.

#### **AWARD**

One scholarship will be awarded for the 2012-2013 academic year to be applied towards tuition, books and fees. This is a continuing award of \$3,000 each year for four years, for a total of \$12,000. The student will receive the \$3,000 award each year as long as he or she carries a full-time schedule and maintains at least a 3.00 GPA.
